This week in worship we heard from the gospel of Luke, in this passage we hear Jesus teaching in the synagogue when a woman enters who has been bent over for many years. Jesus takes the opportunity to ease her suffering and cure her. The leader of the synagogue was shocked that Jesus did work on the Sabbath. Jesus sets him straight saying that after being bound for so many years the woman deserved to be free of her infliction no matter what day it was. In the sermon Pastor Nathan, confessed that he loves following the rules. The leader in the synagogue also loved following the rules. We learn though in Jesus words and life that Gods grace and mercy is more important than the rules. Jesus came to flip the rules around, to bring us a new law, to show us that caring for God's people is exponentially more important than blindly and competitively following rules. The Sabbath rule was brought to give us mercy from overworking ourselves and others. Jesus' life, miracles, and sacrifice on the cross is about bringing us mercy. If we are called to a life in Christ then we to are called to a life of mercy. A life where we see God's mercy and rest for a weary day. Accepting and utilizing that mercy so we can continue renewed. A life where we see Gods mercy and its power. Sharing it in all times especially when we feel the need to cling to the rules. We left Sunday knowing our God is merciful and praising Him that we can show mercy.
